# **Session Descriptions**

## Monday, 19.06.23

#### Official Welcome

The Research Training Group 2725 Urban Future-Making is shortly introduced by Prof. Dr. Monika Grubbauer, spokesperson of the RTG. This is followed by a brief overview of the program for the week and some informal exchange. At the end of this session, there is a talk on strategic aspects of the HafenCity project, given by Dr. Joachim Thiel, Co-Spokesperson of the RTG as a preparation for the following session.

#### **HafenCity Walk**

### Wednesday, 21.06.23

#### **Roundtable Discussion**

The session explores the topics of transformation and future-making with a focus on the city of Hamburg. The round table discussion invites guests from academia and practice to reflect on the challenges of urban transformation in different fields of professional practice and policy-making, such as mobility and energy transitions, citizen involvement, and climate change mitigation strategies. After brief inputs from our invited experts, we open for discussion among all the attendees.

#### Dérive

During this session, the notion of 'the Dérive' is explored and executed. A Dérive is a form of wandering through the city invented by the French philosopher and critical geographer Guy Debord. A dérive, translated literally as 'drift' or 'wander', constitutes an unplanned journey throughout urban ambiences, whereby the sole goal is to discover how the physicality of the city affects the wanderer's emotional-psychological states. Following the Dérive, there is a collective reflection of how this method was experienced.

### Thursday, 22.06.23

#### **Zoom-In Session**

This session is intended to dive deeper into our research projects and explore commonalities in our research. The most pressing problems we face in our research are identified by exploring our individual PhD and research trajectories. More than in academic quantifiable outcomes, we are interested here in the intrinsic motivations, activist horizons and, possibly, deviations that inform and drive our research. To achieve this, we make use of different methods within the framework of the Liberating Structures.

#### **Architecture Site Visit**

13:15-15:30 | Proberaum: Stockmeyerstraße 41-Halle 4b, 20457 Hamburg;

The architecture site visit addresses the topics of temporary architecture, multifunctional use, and professional agency in practice. Three transformational projects, which try to create access to (temporarily) obsolete buildings, are explored: the Proberaum, the Gleishalle, and the Jupiter building. The three minimal interventions represent an alternative to total refurbishment which would require more time and economic investment and illustrate how the agency of architectural and other involved actors finds ways of transforming existing buildings and creating valuable space.
